History. In 1758, Linnaeus described some nematode genera (e.g., *Ascaris*), then included in the Vermes. The name of the group Nematoda, informally called "nematodes", came from Nematodea, originally defined by Karl Rudolphi (1808), from Ancient Greek *nêma*, *nêmatos*, 'thread') and *-ei* (-eid?s, 'species'). It was treated as family Nematodes by Burmeister (1837).
